AADEP recognized in 1999 the need for additional competence (knowledge, skills and attitudes) in the clinical applications required of the disability evaluating physician. The learning gap widened as scientific evidence evolved, increasing a need to develop the skills necessary to change practice patterns and to improve the outcomes an injured worker might expect, to identify the ways industry and insurers address and accommodate the returning workers, and to integrate all aspects of the disability paradigm to achieve greater safety for America's injured workers. AADEP recognizes that to achieve the greater good in disability evaluation, it must assess the current state of affairs and move forward using evidence based medicine as the new gold standard. To this end, the Academy's Advanced Clinical Skills course will offer seven modules designed to:

- Add/enhance clinical skills of disability evaluating physician

- Integrate all aspects of disability paradigm through engagement and education of other healthcare, insurance, legal, governmental, administrative, and employment professionals to better outcomes for injured worker
